DECEMBER HISTORY



(2) NEW COLORS FOR PAINTING OF TRIM OF HOMES ONLY (*TRIM* IS DEFINED AS. ROOF LINE FACIA BOARDS, WINDOW TRIM,FRONT DOOR TRIM, GARAGE DOOR TRIM ALL OF WHICH IS NOT TO EXCEED 8 INCHES IN WIDTH) THE NEW APPROVED COLORS ARE WEDGEWOOD BLUE, HUNTER GREEN, AND GREY THE HOMEOWNER IS LIMITED TO ONLY ONE CHOICE OF THE APPROVED COLOR LISTED ABOVE.
