representatives from our security contractor. There were also five homeowners, one guest, and recorder Mary Lou Verbeck.

The Board of Directors voted to authorize up to \$500.00 for the upcoming country line dance, \$100 for expenses/prizes for the tennis tournament, \$846 to install a gas line in the spa,& \$445 to purchase a new BBQ for the spa area. The Board listened to a response from homeowners regarding a letter sent outlining patio violations.

The Board approved the 1994 Annual Election Committee and related items.

The Board voted to approve the 1995 proposed budget and the increase to \$55.00 of the monthly dues.

The Board authorized writing off \$1,075 as a bad debt (a fore-losed home.) They also voted to send 30-day pay-or-lien letters to three homeowners three + months in arrears, and voted to deny a request from a homeowner to settle an account for a reduced amount.

The Board voted to continue weekend patrols at the pools until the weather cools. Vice-President Ric Cox declared the meeting adjourned at 10:30 p.m.
