BOARD HIGHLIGHTS

n Monday, January 9, 1995, your Park Paseo Board of Directors met at the clubhouse for its regularly scheduled meeting.

President Ernie Jones called the meeting to order at 7:15 p.m. Also present were Directors Ric Cox, Ann Kahn, and Mike Krahelski. Others in attendance were manager Jean Verbeck, recorder Mary Lou Verbeck, a representative from Region One security,

and a principal in Professional Aquatic Services.

Ron Bean from Region One security reported that the club-house and the Prosa pool were "egged and t.p.'d" on New Year's, and that six walkway lights were vandalized.

The Board voted to approve minutes of the December meeting as well as the financial records from December, and the Architectural Committee meeting minutes.

The Board reviewed the recommendations from the Architectural Committee regarding the

new 18-inch roof-mounted satellite dishes and asked for more information on placement and technology. President Ernie Jones reported on the NIVA meeting held at the clubhouse in January. Much of the meeting centered around the financial health of the city of Irvine and the county of Orange.

The Board approved the sale of the current Tropitone chaise lounges for \$20.00 each.


