BOARD HIGHLIGHTS

JULY FOURTH CELEBRATION

n Monday, July 10, 1995, your Park Paseo Board of Directors met at the clubhouse for its regularly scheduled meeting. President Ernie Jones called the meeting to order at 7:15 p.m. Also present were directors Ric Cox, Ann Kahn, Mike Krahelski, and Jeff McCoy, Association manager Perry Carter, and swim team president Ron Finney. Northstars president Ron Finney asked for and re-

ceived permission to use two extra lanes for swim instruction on July 11.

The Board voted to authorize manager Perry Carter to attend a conference for community managers on Sept. 14-15 at a cost of \$195. Mr. Carter was also authorized to spend up to \$150. for on-site computer instruction from Yardi.

Eleven homeowners who were three or more months in arrears in their dues were sent 30-day pay-or-lien letters, and three homeowners four or more months in arrears were sent 10-

day letters from our collection attorney. Reserve Data Associates was selected to perform the reserve analysis at a cost of \$935.




COUNTRY LINE DANCE SET


