BOARD HIGHLIGHTS

MANAGER'S REPORT

n Monday, August 14, 1995, your Park Paseo Board of Directors met at the clubhouse for its regularly scheduled meeting. President Ernie Jones called the meeting to order at 7:15 p.m. Also present were directors Ric Cox, Ann Kahn, Mike Krahelski, and Jeff McCoy, association manager Perry Carter, and two homeowners.

A request for fee-waived use of the clubhouse by the

Girl Scouts, Brownies, and YMCA Indian Princesses was approved. The Babysitting Coop asked for and received permission to hold its meetings in the clubhouse during the year.

The Board voted to authorize manager Perry Carter to attend a CAI luncheon on August 15 at a cost of \$30.

Eight homeowners who were three or more months in arrears in their dues were sent 30-day pay-or-lien letters, and a single homeowner four months in arrears was sent a 10-day letter from our collection attorney.

The Board directed the manager to forward \$175.50 to our attorney to initiate a lawsuit against a homeowner to collect delinquent dues. Minutes from July's meeting were approved, as were minutes from the Architectural committee meeting.

The Board approved spending \$1570 plus freight for a new diving board and hinge anchor plate and approved the proposal by Bruce Sims to reburbish and replace rusted parts on the diving platform.


Plans are presently underway to replace the outdoor carpeting in the wader and tot lot area at the Christamon pool. By the time you read this the diving plat-

The Board directed management to obtain bids to replace the deteriorating outdoor carpeting at the Christamon pool.

The proposal from Pacific Shores Aquatics to provide lifeguard services at a cost of \$11.00 per hour for the remainder of the summer was approved effective August 18, 1995. The previous contractor, PASS, was terminated effective August 17, 1995.

The Board discussed whether the city of Irvine planned to install stop signs at Yale/Hicks Canyon.

The Board directed management to inquire as to the city's intentions and to state our concerns regarding the safe crossing of children in that area.

The Board approved an expenditure of \$250 to pay for a dance instructor, bales of straw, and night lights for the upcoming country line dance, and \$100 for expenses of the tennis tournament.

The meeting was adjourned at 9:15 p.m.

DIVING BOARD INSTALLED


A new 16 foot fiberglass diving board has been installed at the Christamon pool for your diving enjoyment. The eight year old board finally bounced its last and had to be replaced. The diving platform was reburbished by Bruce Sims, our wrought iron specialist, who replaced all rusted parts and painted exposed parts with special epoxy paint. The new board is quite a bit stiffer than the old board but will flex better as it is broken in.

Thank you for your patience. We had to purchase the board from a commercial installation which ships all materials from the east coast.
