#### **BOARD HIGHLIGHTS**

### **MANAGER'S REPORT**

n Monday, October 9, 1995, your Park Paseo Board of Directors met at the clubhouse for its regularly scheduled meeting. President Ernie Jones called the meeting to order at 7:05 p.m. Also present were directors Ric Cox, Mike Krahelski, and Jeff McCoy, and association manager Perry Carter,

The manager announced that 90 proxies had been re-

ceived for the 1995 annual meeting set for October 16.

Six homeowners who were three or more months in arrears in their dues were sent 30-day payor-lien letters, and two homeowners four months in arrears were sent a 10-day letter from our collection attorney. Minutes from September's meeting were approved, as were minutes from the Architectural committee meeting, and September's financial records.

The proposed operating budget for 1996 which calls for an increase of \$1.00 in monthly dues

to \$56.00 was reviewed. The budget was passed unanimously.

A pool maintenance contract proposal submitted by Sweetwater Pools was approved by the Board, as was their proposal to install new pool filters at the Christamon pool at a cost not to exceed \$4,500.

Manager Carter announced that restitution in full (\$456.82) had been received to pay for vandalism to the common area on June 16, 1995 by PPHOA

A quorum was present by proxy and Ric Cox, Ernie Jones, and Mike Krahelski were elected to two year terms on the Board.


Immediately subsequent to the annual meeting, the BOD held its organization meeting to elect officers for the coming year.

Since we received only one bid to re-roof the clubhouse, the Board tabled this item until further bids could be submitted and analyzed.

Manager Carter announced that outdoor carpeting for the wader and totlot areas had been ordered and will be installed the third week of October at a cost of \$647.45. Tree ferns and azaleas at the clubhouse entry were replaced at a cost of \$298.95. Pool heating has been discontinued for both pools and the winter schedule for security takes effect on October 16, 1995.

Correspondence from a homeowner regarding late and noisy parties at the clubhouse was discussed and the Board directed management to correspond with the homeowner that we are closely monitoring the situation and looking for solutions.

There being no further business to come before the Board, the meeting was adjourned at 8:50 p.m.
