BOARD HIGHLIGHTS

MANAGER'S REPORT

n Monday, January 8, 1996, your Park Paseo Board of Directors met at the clubhouse for its regularly scheduled meeting. President Ric Cox called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. Also present were directors Ernie Jones, Mike Krahelski, and Jeff McCoy, association manager Perry Carter, and Northstars Swim Team president Ron Finney. The minutes of the December 8, 1995 BOD meeting


as well as the minutes from the December architectural committee meeting were approved as corrected. The financial records from December were also approved.

Five homeowners who were three or more months in arrears in their dues were sent 30-day pay-or-lien letters, and four homeowners four months in arrears were sent a 10-day letter from our collection attorney.

The Board approved a request by swim team president Ron Finney for use of the clubhouse for an ISL meeting on March 14.

A proposal to lease a copier at a cost of \$68.00 per month was reviewed and the Board directed management to obtain further information and another bid. The Board approved spending up to \$150.00 on a gray scale scanner for use in the the production of the newsletter.

The Board voted to withhold \$100.00 from a security deposit of a clubhouse user because of damage to the facility and other violations. Any large parties will be required to pay for security guards in the future.





The Association's calendar year- end is over and a review of actual income and total expense compared to our budget projections reflects that income exceeded total expense by \$3,946., subject to auditor's review. This performance is a reflection of the high level of fiscal responsibility exercised by your Board of Directors.

y February. 1979. Park Paseo was taking shape in the new village of Northwood. Ponderosa Homes still had three votes on the BOD, and we had yet to get an on site manager, as Alta management had been hired to manage our facilities. 214 homes were occupied as of this date and an election to decide whether to heat the pool year-round and add lights to the tennis court at an increased cost of \$2.24 a month failed 36 to 47. Another option to open the clubhouse 7 days a week, heat the pool, and light the tennis courts at an increase of \$9.85 per month also failed by a vote of 18 to 55. What a frugal group that was.

The Babysitting Co-Op was in full swing, run by Bernadette Truffa and Donna Nourse and they were hosting a membership coffee on Feb. 8, 1979 for interested mothers.

A new phase of 50 Park Paseo homes was scheduled to go on sale the week of Feb. 25th, and the Park Place phase which opened in January had 8 homes left to sell. Interest rates were 9.75%.

The Activities Committee, chaired by Ann Jones was planning a community swap meet for April, selling spaces in the clubhouse parking lot for \$5.00 apiece.

A Community Luau had been tentatively scheduled for September, and the 2nd annual 4th of July extravaganza was already in the planning stages.

Family Skating Night at Skateway Roller Rink in Mission Viejo at an astronomical price of 50c a ticket was scheduled for March 8, reported Mark Roddy, Santiago Hills news reporter.

The BOD were obtaining bids to install an interior door in the clubhouse to separate the restroom/sauna area from the rest of the facility.
