President Ric Cox called the meeting to order at 7:00
p.m. Also present were directors Ernie Jones, Mike
Krahelski, and Jeff McCoy, and association manager Perry Carter. The minutes of the May, 1996

BOD meeting as well as the minutes from the May architectural committee meeting were approved as corrected. The financial records from May, 1996 were also approved.



n response to many inquiries, this month's report will be devoted to defining the Green Tag and Blue Tag programs.

- 1. GREEN TAGS are designed for youths 10-13 who may swim without parents WHEN A LIFEGUARD IS PRESENT. Requirements for obtaining and keeping a green tag are:
 - A. Applicants must pass a beginning Red Cross test given by the association's pol monitor.
 - B. Green tag holders may not bring guests to pool.
 - C. Green tag must must be on/with swimmer at all times.
 - D. Green tag must not be lent to another. Penalty is loss of green tag privileges for 30 days.
 - E. Directions of pool monitor must be obeyed at all times. Penalty is loss of tag for swim season.
- 2.**BLUE TAGS** are for 9/10 yr. olds on Northstars to come to swim team practice without parents. Requirements are:
 - A. Applicants must pass beginning Red Cross test.
 - B. Blue Tag may only be used during swim team practice. As soon as practice is completed, swimmer must leave.
- C. No guests on Blue tag. No lending tag to others. Applications for either tag may be obtained at the clubhouse. I will be happy to review the application in detail at the time of issuance.





- 4. Games to be played to 15. (Default score 1-0) Must win by 2 pts. Final game to 21 points.




