BOARD HIGHLIGHTS

n Monday, October 14, 1996, your Park Paseo Board of Directors met at the clubhouse for its regularly scheduled meeting. President Ric Cox called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. Also present were directors Ernie Jones, Mike Krahelski, Jeff McCoy, and Ann Kahn, association manager Perry Carter, seven homeowners (including two rep-

resenting the Northstars swim team), and two prospective security company representatives. The minutes of the September, 1996 BOD meeting as well as the minutes from the September architectural committee meeting were approved as corrected. The financial records from September, 1996 were also approved.

Six homeowners who were three months in arrears in their dues were sent 30-day pay-or-lien letters, and four homeowners four months or more in arrears were sent a 10-day letter from our collection attorney.

Five homeowners attended hearings to contest proposed \$25.00 fines for basketball backboard violations.

The Board interviewed two prospective security companies for the purpose of selecting a new company for the upcoming season. The firm of Protection and Associates was selected to present a transition plan for Park Paseo security in the off-season and present it at the November board meeting.

Three youth groups were granted use of the clubhouse on a waived-fee basis subject to the groups' volunteering for an upcoming Park Paseo function. One youth group's request was not approved because the roster was not composed of a majority of Park Paseo children.

The Board approved the proposed 1997 budget calling for a modest \$1.00 per month increase in dues and directed management to mail it to all homeowners by November 15, 1996 as required by law.

The Board, after a lengthy review, adopted a new antenna installation policy presented by our law firm. The PPHOA Board invited representatives of the Northstars swim team board to attend the meeting to discuss both the past season and the upcoming 1997 swim season. Both boards agreed on meeting in the future to keep communication open and to establish mutual goals.

There being no further business to come before the board, the meeting was adjourned at 10:40 p.m.
