### LOOKING BACK TO PARK PRESS 1982

n Monday, November 11, 1996, your Park Paseo Board of Directors met at the clubhouse for its regularly scheduled meeting. President Mike Krahelski called the meeting to order at 7:05 p.m. Also present were directors Jeff McCoy, Ernie Jones, Ann Kahn, and Ric Cox, and association manager Perry Carter. The minutes of the October,

1996 BOD meeting as well as the minutes from the October architectural committee meeting were approved as corrected. The financial records from October, 1996 were also approved.

Five homeowners four months or more in arrears were sent a 10-day letter from our collection attorney.

One homeowner attended to deliver a letter protesting a basketball backboard violation. The letter was referred to legal counsel for review and response.

The Board directed management to notify Region One security that


their services would be terminated as of November 30, 1996. The firm of Protection and Associates' transition plan effective December 1, 1996 for Park Paseo security was approved unanimously subject to certain insurance and licensing conditions being met. The Board voted to renew our State Farm liability policy subject to an increase (to \$25,000) in medical payments provisions.



- o Have your car keys in hand so you don't have to linger before entering your car. Keys can also serve as a weapon against an attacker.
- o Avoid setting down your purchases when getting into your


