BOARD HIGHLIGHTS

IUSD SEEKS NORTHWOOD POINT HELP

n Monday, December 9, 1996, your Park Paseo Board of Directors met at the clubhouse for its regularly scheduled meeting. President Mike Krahelski called the meeting to order at 7:10 p.m. Also present were directors Jeff McCoy, Ernie Jones, Ann Kahn, and Ric Cox, association manager Perry Carter, and Brad Walker of Fiore, Walker,

Racobs and Powers. The minutes of the November, 1996 BOD meeting as well as the minutes from the November architectural committee meeting were approved as corrected. The financial records from November 1996 were also approved.

Six homeowners who were three months in arrears in their dues were sent 30 day pay-or-lien letters, and one homeowner four months in arrears was sent a 10-day letter from our collection attorney.

Attorney Brad Walker attended the meeting at the request of the


BOD to discuss his recommendations for enforcing basketball backboard rules violations. He outlined his opinions in a lively O & A session.

spa, and wader re-lining with fiberglass would commence in mid-January 1997.

The Board reviewed correspondence from a homeowner that requested removal of windrow trees adjacent to his property. The Board directed management to communicate with the homeowner that the trees were scheduled for trimming in January 1997 and would not be removed. The Board requested that Earthcare Landscape be present at the January meeting to discuss tree care and trimming. The Board also requested that management obtain bids for trimming of the windrow trees during the first quarter of 1997.

Manager Carter reported that there were currently no basketball backboards visible on homeowners' property as of his last drive through.

There being no further business to come before the board, the meeting was adjourned at 8:50 p.m.

Il 239 Eucalyptus globulus trees in our windrows will be pruned to International Society of Arborist standards, and the definitive schedule for the project will be included in the February issue of the Park Press.

The contract has been let for the refinishing of the main pool, spa, and wader. The finish will be a fiberglass lining which has a fifteen year warranty. (Our previous re-plastering lasted approximately 9 years.) The work will be performed by Advanced Pool Coatings, the company that completed many similar projects in Woodbridge. Work is expected to commence between the middle to end of this month. Completion is anticipated to take approximately seven working days, and during this time the pool, spa, and wader will not be usable. Each of the affected areas will be posted and taped off. Now that the holiday season is almost over, it is time to remind homeowners that all exterior decorations and lights must be removed from residences by February 1, 1997 in order to avoid an architectural violation letter. Your cooperation will be appreciated by all.
