

TOWN HALL UPDATE

On March 26th, a standing room only crowd of more than 100 Park Paseo residents filled the clubhouse to gather information on possible future uses of MCAS El Toro and to discuss plans for its reuse. The Town Meeting featured prominent local leaders involved in the struggle over the future of the 4,700 acre base.

Bill Kogerman, executive director of Taxpayers for Resposible Planning, gave a slide presentation focused on the County of Orange's current strategy to lead a conversion of the base to a large, international passenger and cargo airport. His talk was punctuated by a sound system rigged to repeatedly broadcast a simulation of the noise that would be generated if planes are allowed to take off over Northwood. He went on to describe TRP's lawsuit filed to stop the county from pursuing an aviation use. Ed Pope and Karen Byers, representing Project '99, outlined their organization's effort to create a coordinated reuse plan for the base, including research and development facilities, parks, a university campus, and other 'neighborhood friendly' developments. They also stressed the potentially harmful effects that a large-scale airport would bring, specifically: noise, pollution, traffic congestion, and a decline in home values. Project 99 is an Irvine-based organization. City councilman Dave Christensen and planning commissioner George Gallagher pledged to continue the city's war against the airport. Mr. Christensen discussed a monorail system joining OC airport and LAX. Pro-airport supporters declined an invitation to attend the meeting.

uring the first week in June, both the Christamon and Prosa totlot play equipment will be razed, and new, updated play equipment will be installed. The new equipment meets all safety standards and will be a welcome addition to Park Paseo's fine amenities.

The newly refinished parking lot at the recreation center will be slurry sealed and re-striped. All of the parking spaces on the west side of the parking lot have been designated for Park Paseo facility parking only and tow away signs have been posted for unauthorized use. Since the re-striping, parking for PPHOA residents has improved dramatically.
