BOARD HIGHLIGHTS

Swim Team Proposes Afternoon Practices

n Monday February 9, 1998, your Park Paseo Board of Directors met at the clubhouse for its regularly scheduled meeting. President Ann Kahn called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. Also present were directors Mike Krahelski, Jeff Mc-Coy, Ric Cox, and Ernie Jones, association manager Perry Carter, two officers from

the Northstars swim team, and four homeowners.

The minutes of the January 1998 BOD meeting as well as the minutes from the January Architectural committee meeting were approved as corrected. The financial records from January 1998 were also approved.

The Board directed management to send thirty-day letters to seven homeowners who were delinquent three months in their dues, and ten-day letters to two accounts which were four months in arrears.

Nick Ellis and Diane Brand of the Northstars presented the proposed afternoon swim schedule to the board and asked for three Saturday meets and one possible mid-week relay. The Board agreed in principle to afternoon practices, since so many of the Park Paseo swimmers are enrolled in other activities which may occupy their mornings, but told the Northstars that it would ask for input from the community as to whether the recreational swimmers would be willing to give up the majority of the pool from 3-7 p.m. daily. 

The PPHOA Board asked Park Press editor Ric Cox to insert a ballot into this edition of the paper asking whether this could create a hardship on recreational swimmers and family BBQ times. The swim team has requested practice times from 3-7 p.m. Mon-Fri. This would only allow 1-2 lanes for the community during this time (June-August.)

Two homeowners attended to seek information on a potential zero lot line easement violation. Water has been draining into their residence during heavy rainfalls and they would like to permanently solve the problem. Two homeowners attended to discuss a basketball backboard violation letter they received and to ask for an exception to the rule. Park Press editor Ric Cox volunteered to place a "ballot question" in the next issue of the Park Press to see if the sentiments regarding basketball backboards have changed in the community. The Board voted to approve a waived-fee use of the clubhouse by Santiago Hills sixth grade for a year-end dance.

The Board approved a proposal to apply a fiber-glass surface to the Prosa pool at a cost of \$16,606.00. This amount includes re-sealing all joints in the decking. The Board reviewed proposals for a new office computer, software, and laser printer and awarded the bid to Micro Center at a cost of \$2927.00. Bids from Pacific Sales for a new refrigerator and stove were approved at a cost of \$447.00 and \$497.00 respectively. Earthcare Landscape's bid to spray 13 Ficus trees for fruit suppression at a cost of \$980.00 was approved.

There being no further business to come before the board, the meeting was adjourned at 9:35 p.m.

pring is here and this is the time when most home improvement projects are begun. I will take this opportunity to remind all homeowners that exterior painting of your residence and all other changes or improvements require approval of our Association's Architectural Committee prior to any work commencing.

All forms for painting and changes may be obtained at the clubhouse office and I will be happy to discuss the proper completion of the forms with you when you pick them up. The painting form is only one page and requires paint chips for trim, siding, and stucco. The same form is used for new garage doors and must be accompanied by a brochure photo of the new door.

All other exterior additions/improvements require the use of the **Home Application Form** which has detailed instructions for completion as well as required plans and blueprints.

Spring is the season for home projects. Remember that all changes to residences, including paint, garage doors, window treatments, and landscaping require Architectural Committee approval.

Failure to obtain the necessary prior approvals constitutes a violation of the CC&R's and may require modification or


removal of unauthorized work at the expense of the homeowner. Commencing work before it has been approved by the committee also subjects the owner to a \$50,00 fine.

The Association is fortunate to have an Architectural Committee comprised of qualified and reasonable members of long standing as well as a licensed architect.

Architectural Committee meetings are held on the last Wednesday of every month at 7:00 p.m. in the association's clubhouse. If you have any further questions, please don't hesitate to call me at 730-1560.
