
## SUMMER IN PARK PASEO

n Monday May 11, 1998, your Park Paseo
Board of Directors met at the clubhouse
for its regularly scheduled meeting. President Ann
Kahn called the meeting to order at 7:05 p.m. Also
present were directors Mike Krahelski, Jeff McCoy,
Ric Cox, Ernie Jones, association manager Perry
Carter, and one homeowner.

The minutes of the April, 1998 BOD meeting as well as the minutes from the April Architectural committee meeting were approved as corrected. The financial records from April 1998 were also approved.

The Board directed management to send thirty-day letters to eight homeowners who were delinquent three months in their dues, ten-day letters to two accounts which were four months in arrears, and to forward money to the attorney to proceed with litigation on one account.

Robco Insurance proposed a change in D&O insurance carriers from Seaboard Surety to Chubb because of a reduction in premium and other benefits. The BOD approved the proposal. Management addressed a problem of commercial vehicles parking on Delamesa West for extended periods. The BOD directed manager Carter to send a letter to the homeowners informing them that guests are not to park commercial vehicles on the street. A homeowner spoke to the BOD regarding vehicle noise emanating from Hines Nursery late at night and asked if any other complaints had been received. (Please see Pg. 3)

The BOD directed management to send a letter to Hines Nursery requesting information about their late-night work shift and to see if a noise reduction could be worked out. Furthermore, the BOD asked Park Press editor Ric Cox to insert an inquiry into the monthly newsletter asking if other homeowners have been similarly inconvenienced.

Manager Carter informed the BOD that a homeowner brought his son to the Park Paseo office after receiving a letter concerning the son's vandalism. The homeowner assured the manager that it would not occur again and agreed to pay for the damages.

Our landscaper, Earthcare Landscape sent a letter offering to donate a 24-inch box Southern Magnolia tree for our grounds. The BOD instructed manager Carter to write a letter to express our gratitude.

Architectural violation notices were reviewed by the BOD and two homeowners were invited to attend the June board meeting.

There being no further business to come before the board, the meeting was adjourned at 8:40 p.m.

## MANAGER'S REPORT: Spring Swim Season

he summer schedule at both the Christamon pool and the Prosa pool will commence on June 18th and continue through the summer and perhaps longer, depending on weather conditions.

During this time, lifeguards will be on duty from 12:00 noon to 8:00 p.m. at the Christamon pool and from 12:00 noon to 6:00 p.m. at the Prosa pool each day.

Security guards will be on duty from 10:00 a.m. to midnight daily at the Christamon pool. They will be stationed just under the patio enclosure to sign homeowners in. Please be cooperative in signing in and showing your key so we may maintain our beautiful facility.


The swim team practice schedule during the summer will be from 2:00-6:00 p.m. Monday through Thursday with two lanes in use (which leaves the diving board open.) One additional lane may be used from 2:00 p.m. to 4:30 p.m. at the manager's discretion (depending on homeowner swim traffic at the time.)

The home swim meet schedule is as follows:
Saturday June 13th-8:00 a.m.-2:00 p.m.
Saturday June 20th-8:00 a.m.-2:00 p.m.
Thursday July 16th-1:00 p.m.-7:30 p.m.
(Above is a relay meet-tentative)
Saturday July 18th-8:00 a.m.-2:00 p.m.
Saturday July 25th-8:00 a.m.-2:00 p.m.

#### REMINDERS

- 1. Children under 14 years of age cannot come to the pool unless accompanied by an adult (18 years of age or older.) The <u>only</u> exception to this is a child who has a valid, registered **Green Tag** who may come to the pool any time a lifeguard is on duty. They may not bring guests.
- 3. **Blue Tag swimmers** (on the Northstars) may only come to the pool unsupervised when their age group is practicing during official swim team practice.
- 4. Babysitters bringing children to the pool must be physically present at all times with the children and must supervise them at all times. Babysitters cannot be outside the pool area when their charges are inside.
