BOARD HIGHLIGHTS

COMMUNITY NEWS: Northstars+Clear the Air/No Jets

n Monday January 11, 1998, your Park Paseo Board of Directors met at the clubhouse for its regularly scheduled meeting. Vice-President Mike Krahelski called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. Also present were directors Ann Kahn and Ric Cox, manager Perry Carter, and two homeowners.

The minutes of the December 1998 BOD meeting were approved as corrected. The financial records from December 1998 were also approved. There was no December Architectural Committee meeting.

The Board directed management to send thirty day letters to five homeowners three months in arrears and ten-day letters to four homeowners four months in arrears.

The Board voted to invest a \$80,000.00 CD in a federally insured financial institution at the best available rate.

A homeowner addressed the Board and requested use of the clubhouse on a fee-waived basis for Cub Scout meetings to be held on the third Wednesday of every month. Her request was approved subject to receipt of a roster showing that more than 50% of the members are Park Paseo residents. The Board requested that the next issue of the Park Press include an article regarding Clear the Air/No Jets.

There being no further business to come before the Board, the meeting was adjourned at 7:50 p.m.

The next meeting was set for Monday, February 8, 1999 at 7:00 p.m.

Recycling Update

Irvine begins its new recycling program on February 1, 1999 when it rolls out 74,000 new trash "carts" to the 28,000 homes in Irvine that have curbside pickup. This is part of Irvine's commitment to meet the state-mandated goal of reducing the amount of waste being transported to local landfills by 50% by the year 2000.

Irvine residents were given a choice of receiving 35, 64 or 96 gallon-sized carts depending on their needs. According to Waste Management, sixty per cent of Irvine residents responded to a survey included with their utility bill asking for size preference. If you did not respond to the survey you will receive three 64-gallon sized containers. If the size you receive does not work out they may exchanged for another size.

Instead of separating recyclables into three containers as we currently do with newspapers, plastics, glass, tin, and aluminum, there will be one cart for all recyclables which will have a gray lid. Another cart with a blue lid will be for all trash that cannot be recycled. The third cart with a green lid will be for "green" trash such as yard clippings, branches, and weeds. All carts will be outfitted with wheels to make them easier to transport to curbside for pickup.

If you wish to discard your old trash receptacles, stickers will be provided so that Waste Management will know to pick them up. The old crates may be kept, along with your good trash cans, and come in handy for earthquake or emergency storage.

t's tree trimming time again, and the trimming of 205 selected trees will commence during the middle part of February. This work will be completed in approximately five working days, weather permitting. There will be a noise factor at times during the day, and your co-operation and understanding will be greatly appreciated.


Please inform all in your household of the work in progress and ask that they avoid, is possible, the work areas in the interest of safety. Caution should be exercised when walking near the work areas as falling branches, leaves and debris could be a hazard throughout this period. Heavy equipment, including trucks with elevated buckets will be present in the work areas and must be avoided.

By the time you read this, the new **Alba totlot** will have been completed. All of the old play equipment will have been removed and all new equipment installed in its place. The new equipment will be in compliance with all safety codes and laws and was selected to provide the maximum equipment in the allocated space. In the last two years, as part of our reserve commitment, we have replaced the totlot at the Christamon pool, the play equipment at the Prosa pool and now the Alba totlot.

A recent inspection and drive through of the as sociation reveals that many homeowners still do not inderstand that trash receptacles must be stored from view on the same day the trash is picked up by Waste Management Company. My Manager's Report in the January issue of the Park Press was devoted solely to this growing problem and outlined the reasons trash receptacles need to be stored out of sight. Instead of restating the information from that column I will simply remind all affected that our fine schedule calls for a \$25.00 fine for the second offense, and a \$50.00 fine for the third offense.

Your cooperation in resolving this problem and making Park Paseo a safer, more beautiful place in which to live will be appreciated by all—especially those who are committed to maintaining the community pride that exists here in Park Paseo.
