Park Paseo Northstars, and another homeowner.



Lifeguards will be on duty from noon-6:00 p.m. at both pools on Fridays, Saturdays, and Sundays when the weather is sunny and warm.

Correspondence from our attorney regarding homeowner responsibility for private property maintenance was discussed.

NEW TRASH RECEPTACLES PRESENT A STORAGE CHALLENGE

The new, large green trash receptacles provide a uniform look for the city on curbside pick-up day but they can be a real challenge to store out of the way. After this month, curbside haulers will not pick up debris left outside the containers. They will pick up your old containers, filled or unfilled, if tagged with "take me" labels.

MANAGER'S REPORT: Clubhouse Reservations

The season for high-volume usage of the clubhouse for parties has arrived and, due to a large number of calls requesting clubhouse rental information, I submit the following outline of rules and fees for your information:

• Fees

- A. \$125.00 fee for Friday/Saturday usage beginning at 3:00 p.m. and ending at 12:00 midnight.
- B. \$100.00 fee for Sunday-Thursday 3:00-10:00.
- C. \$100.00 fee for adult functions from 10:00-3:00
- D. Children's party fee is \$50.00 for 10:00-3:00 p.m. period for any day.
- E. Additional fee for dance floor is \$75.00. (Mandatory if music is provided.)
- F. Security deposit is \$200.00 to cover damage, loss, or breakage.

• Rules (General)


A. Reservations are for the interior of the clubhouse only. All other facilities must remain open for use of the general membership. Patios, decks, pool, and spa are not reservable.


- B. Reservation is confirmed when entire fee and signed clubhouse contract are received.
 - C. No alcoholic beverages served to minors.
- D. Each homeowner is entitled to two annual clubhouse reservations. Additional requests must be approved by the Board.
- E. Any commercial use must be approved by the Board.
- F. Any damage, loss, or breakage exceeding the security deposit will be added to the homeowner's account as a special assessment.

I will review the clubhouse use agreement with the prospective user in more detail at the time it is to be signed by the homeowner and I will answer any questions you may have at that time.

If you will remember to treat the clubhouse as though you are a guest in someone's home, there shouldn't be any problems and your security, deposit should be safe.
