## COMMUNITY NEWS: July 4th Festivities

n Monday June 14, 1999, your Park Paseo
Board of Directors met at the clubhouse
for its regularly scheduled meeting. President Jeff
McCoy called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.
Also present were directors Mike Krahelski, Ann
Kahn, Ernie Jones, and Ric Cox, manager Perry
Carter, Kelly Gilroy from the

Park Paseo Northstars, and four homeowners.

The minutes of the May 1999 BOD meeting were approved as corrected. The financial records from May 1999 were also approved. The minutes from the May Architectural Committee meeting were approved as corrected.

The Board directed management to send a thirty-day letter to six homeowners three months in arrears, and a ten-day letter to one homeowner four months in arrears.

Kelly Gilroy addressed the Board and requested an additional Saturday swim meet (7/31) because of an ISL conflict. She also stated that the lane line spool had disintegrated and would need to be repaired or replaced. The Board discussed the proposal and asked manager Carter to see if our wrought iron repairman could fabricate an inexpensive repair.

Four homeowners appeared to discuss architectural rules violations. Three were regarding basketball backboards and the fourth concerned a tree-house.


11:00-Snack Bar Opens-Hot dogs, burgers, sodas, snacks, snocones, and candy will be sold as a

The Park Paseo Monthly Landscape Beautification Award was discussed and President Jeff McCoy announced that the winner for July was Leslee & Gino Effler of 24 Delamesa West. (See photo and caption on page 4/calendar.)

The Board discussed a proposal from EarthCare landscaping to remove Eucalyptus windrow trees and plant a number of hedges, trees, and ground cover around Park Paseo. Since the list was extensive, the Board requested a detailed map of the planting and asked that a member of EarthCare be present to discuss questions the Board had regarding the necessity of the tree removals.

The Board approved the reserve study update proposal in the amount of \$940.00. A CD maturing 6/30/99 in the amount of \$50,000 is to be reinvested.

Management reported on a near-drowning incident at the Christamon pool. Procedures for monitoring the pools by the lifeguards and security guards were reviewed to prevent such accidents in the future.

Management reviewed the letter from our attorney regarding "portable" basketball backboards. The Board decided to continue enforcement of the existing rules unless homeowners prefer (by vote) a change in the current rules.

There being no further business to come before the Board, the meeting was adjourned at 9:40 p.m. The next meeting was set for Monday, July 12, 1999 at 7:00 p.m.

he Park Paseo Board of Directors, working closely with our Architectural Committee, has come up with a list of approved materials and procedures for roof replacement. This was done in anticipation of re-roofing needs of our community as we approach the twenty year mark.

The following list of approved and unapproved roofing materials was unanimously approved by the Board of Directors at their meeting on July 13, 1998.

#### **UNAPPROVED MATERIALS**

- 1. Asphalt composition of any type
- 2. Fiberglass shakes or shingles

#### APPROVED MATERIALS

- 1. Wood Shakes-must meet all city of Irvine building codes and be fire retardant and pressure treated.
- 2. Tile-Spanish (as originally installed)
- 3. Tile simulated shakes
- 4. Cement composition simulated shakes
- 5. Cement composition simulated tile
- \*6. Steel-based simulated tile
- \*7. Steel-based simulated shakes
- \*Old roof must be removed prior to the install ion of any steel-based material.

Homeowners are reminded that there is a \$50.00 fine if work is commenced prior to architectural committee approval.

- 6. You must have fun!




