
The Board directed manage-

After a lengthy discussion the Board approved use of polypropylene (vinyl) siding on Park Paseo homes as presented by Mr. Lick. Homeowners wishing to find out more about the siding should visit the clubhouse and view actual samples.

The Board approved a proposal by EarthCare for the planting of ground cover and additional shrubs around Park Paseo where needed, but declined the portion of the proposal for the planting of 52 additional trees. The Board also declined to remove various common area eucalyptus trees which were healthy and posed no risks to homeowners.

A discussion was held relative to the July 4th festivities and Ric Cox announced that there was a good crowd on hand, the day was sunny and bright, and that kids and adults alike had a great day. He thanked all those who helped make the day a success through their participation. The Park Paseo Northstars took in over \$500.00 at the snack bar to assist with their fund raising for future events and equipment repair.

Two homeowners were sent letters reminding them to remove basketball backboards from view when not in use.

MANAGER'S REPORT: Vinyl Siding Approved

t their July meeting, the Board of Directors and the Architectural committee approved an alternative product for wood siding and trim for use on Park Paseo homes.

The product material is made of polypropylene (vinyl) and the siding material is molded from real cedar shingles for a natural looking shingle without the expense and heavy maintenance of wood.

Other features of the product are:

- Two styles to choose from-Double 7" shingle or Double 6 1/4" half-round shingle
- Designed and tested to withstand wind load pressures up to 180 mph.
- Molded perimeter lock creates a seamless appearance.
- 10 shingle colors to choose from
- Virtually maintenance free-never needs painting. Only maintenance required is spraying with pressure washer or high-pressure garden hose.
- Offers a wide range of matching and contrasting trim colors.
- Limited lifetime warranty.

The manufacturer of the product is CertainTeed Corporation which also makes vinyl windows and roofing products.

EUCALYPTUS TREES FACE THREAT

Eucalyptus trees in Northwood have been attacked by a near-microscopic insect called a "red gum psyllid" in recent weeks. Infested trees appear limp or weak and have small white egg-like structures called lerps on the underside of leaves. The psyllids are not attacking our large windrow eucalyptus, but rather the smaller, red-barked cousins which appear along Yale, Park Place, and Meadowood. Treatment includes spraying and a systemic agent which is absorbed.


