COMMUNITY NEWS: **Swim Team Awards**

n Monday August 9, 1999, your Park Paseo Board of Directors met at the clubhouse for its regularly scheduled meeting. President Jeff McCoy called the meeting to order at 7:00 P.M. Also present were directors Mike Krahelski, and Ernie Jones and manager Perry Carter.

The minutes of the July 1999 BOD meeting were approved as corrected. The financial records from July 1999 were also approved. The minutes from the July Architectural Committee meeting were approved as cor-The Action items/responses from the July BOD meeting were reviewed.

The Board directed management to send thirty-day letters to four homeowners three months in arrears in their dues, and tenday letters to five homeowners four months in arrears. Two accounts were sent to the attorney for collection.

The Board approved the 1999 Reserve Study. A request by a homeowner to rescind late fees was denied. Management was directed to consult with our attorney to determine the most expedient way to correct longstanding architectural violations.

EarthCare Landscape's proposal for new plantings in the large terra cotta pots at the clubhouse was approved. The Board voted to select a September landscape award winner for Park Paseo.

There being no further business to come before the board, the meeting was adjourned at 7:55 P.M. The next meeting will be September 13, 1999.

W ith over 1600 swimmers from 17 teams in the Irvine Swim League championships, the competition was intense on August 14th. Each year new teams and swimmers are added to the league, making competition for individual and team awards more difficult. Despite this fact, our Park Paseo Northstars were able to capture

MANAGER'S REPORT: Reminders-Trash & Leashes



recent influx of complaints from homeowners have made the following reminders nec-

essary:

1. Trash to be picked up weekly by Waste Management Company is not to be put out for pick up until the evening before the day it is to be picked up (generally Sunday night.) And trash receptacles are to be removed from view not later than the same evening of the day the trash was picked up (generally Monday.) This procedure applies to all green, recycling, and trash bins.

If the procedure is not followed, it presents an unsightly appearance to the neighborhood and can lead to unwanted visits by different types of animals.

2. Many of our Park Paseo homeowners are respecting the leash law when on our common areas with their pets, but it has been observed that some are not making the effort to clean up after them. Pet owners are expected to clean up after their pets in both common areas and yards (their own and those of others.)

Pet owners who allow their pets to run loose could create a real liability problem for both themselves and others in the general area.



AIRPORT FOES SET SIGNATURE RECORD

The "Safe and Healthy Communities" initiative needed 71,200 valid signatures to quality for a March ballot spot. Organizers turned in over 190,000 signatures by month-end making it the most successful petition drive in Orange County history.

The initiative, if passed, will require a two-thirds vote before toxic landfills, prisons in the vicinity of homes, and airports can be built. The drive enlisted over 5,000 volunteers from all over Orange County.
