BOARD HIGHLIGHTS

BASKETBALL BACKBOARDS: Shoot-or get off the court!

n Monday October 11, 1999, your Park
Paseo Board of Directors met at the clubhouse for its regularly scheduled meeting. President Jeff McCoy called the meeting to order at 7:00
P.M. Also present were directors Mike Krahelski,
Ann Kahn, Ernie Jones, and Ric Cox, manager Perry
Carter, and sixteen homeowners.

The minutes of the September 1999 BOD meeting were approved as corrected. The financial records from September 1999 were also approved. The minutes from the September Architectural Committee meeting were approved as corrected. The Action items/responses from the September BOD meeting were reviewed.

The Board directed management to send thirty-day letters to four homeowners three months in arrears in their dues, and a ten-day letter to one homeowner

four months in arrears. One account was sent to the attorney for collection.

The Board listened to homeowners who were invited to share their views regarding basketball backboards. The majority present at the meeting were in favor of allowing backboards, either free-standing or attached to the home, as long as reasonable regulations regarding their placement and use were in place.

The Board voted to present two issues regarding basketball backboards to the community. Either change the CC &R's, or adopt reasonable regulations governing backboards. (See next column.)

he Park Paseo Board, in response to community requests, has polled our population a number of times regarding basketball backboards. The last two polls were conducted as a result of the influx of "portable" backboards. The results of these polls have always been overwhelmingly against allowing backboards.


The Board has always been responsive to community sentiments.

The Board has always been responsive to community sentiment. The booklet of Architectural Rules & Regulations was created by homeowners to reflect the sentiments of the homeowners.

The Board has now reached an impasse. A small, but vocal group in Park Paseo would like backboards. The community seems to support a backboard ban. Our attorney has told us that because backboards aren't mentioned specifically in our CC & R's that such a ban could be more difficult to enforce. In fact, all

associations that ban backboards in Irvine have language in their CC & R's which prohibit them. Ours does not. Our first step, then, is to ask those who favor banning backboards if they would like to amend our CC & R's to ban them.

This is not an easy task. To amend our governing documents, we need 3/4 of our homeowners to vote for a proposal. If the community still feels strongly that backboards should be banned and can garner the 3/4 majority necessary-they will be prohibited. If the amendment fails, the Board will construct a set of reasonable regulations governing their placement and use. Watch for a ballot-and please vote.
