BOARD HIGHLIGHTS

Swim Team Update 1st Team Meeting Set for May 3rd.

n Monday March 13, 2000, your Park Paseo Board of Directors met at the clubhouse for its regularly scheduled meeting. President Ernie Jones called the meeting to order at 7:00 P.M. Also present were directors Mike Krahelski, Ann Kahn, and Ric Cox, manager Perry Carter, and one homeowner.

The minutes of the February, 2000 BOD meeting were approved as corrected. The financial records from February, 2000 were also approved. The minutes from the February Architectural Committee meeting were approved as corrected. The Action items/responses from the February BOD meeting were reviewed.


The Board directed management to send thirty-day letters to three homeowners three months in arrears in their dues, a ten-day letter to one homeowner four months in arrears, and to send

one account to our attorney for collection.

The Board directed management to renew a \$50,000 CD in a federally insured institution at the best available rate.

A homeowner appeared before the Board to inquire about trimming association trees which encroach onto her property. The Board directed manager Carter to have EarthCare Landscape visit the property to evaluate the problem and to report back.

A bid by Chaidez Tree Service to trim our 230 windrow Eucalyptus at a cost of \$95.00 per tree was approved. (See page 3)

residence at 9 Delamesa East as the April 2000 landscape award winner. Congratulations and thanks for making Park Paseo a more beautiful place to live.


