Pool Closure Inconveniences Swimmers

The Christamon pool has had to close three times this summer because of fecal contamination. Two of the closures were due to "diaper accidents" and one may have been nighttime sabotage which forced the Northstars to postpone a Saturday swim meet and inconvenienced hundreds of swimmers and early rising parents. The OC Health Dept. which oversees public pools mandates that a 24 hour closure must occur to allow the filtration system to remove bacteria. Please use the pool responsibly and oversee your children.

City Laws & Ordinances


Please review the following list of city laws and ordinances. Pay particular attention to the last item which deals with loud parties and the sanctions for violations. By avoiding the "Loud Party" notice you will save yourself some money and be more popular with your neighbors.

- No one under the age of 18 can be in a public street, building, or entertainment place between 10:00 P.M.-6:00 A.M. unless they are with their parents or a guardian. This includes the Fun Center.
- No one under the age of 14 can be left home or anywhere else without supervision by a responsible person between 10:00 P.M.-6:00 A.M.
- Anyone buying a bicycle must have it registered with the Irvine P.D. within 10 days of purchase.
- The Irvine P.D. can issue a "Loud Party Notice if they are called to a location where there is a loud party, gathering, or event. If the police have to return to the same location within 30 days for a loud gathering, the owner/parents will have to pay all costs for city personnel & equipment used during this response. Minimum fine is \$250.00.


