Community News: Basketball Backboards

n Monday September 11, 2000, your Park Paseo Board of Directors met at the clubhouse for its regularly scheduled meeting. President Ernie Jones called the meeting to order at 7:10 P.M. Also present were directors Ric Cox, Jeff McCoy, Mike Krahelski, & Ann Kahn, and manager Perry Carter.

The minutes of the August, 2000 BOD meeting were approved as corrected. The financial records from the August 2000 meeting were approved. The minutes from the August Architectural Committee meeting were approved as corrected. The Action items/responses from the August BOD meeting were reviewed.


The Board directed management to send thirty-day letters to three homeowners three months in arrears in their dues, and tenday letters to six homeowners four months in arrears.

Requests by two youth groups to use the clubhouse on a waived-fee basis were approved since both met the residency requirements.

The October landscape beautification award was given to the Sproul family of 12 Eden.

The proposed annual meeting mailing material was reviewed and approved and the annual meeting was set for October 16, 2000 at 7:00 P.M. in the clubhouse. Homeowners will receive ballots with this month's dues statements.

The on-site reserve study recently completed by Reserve Data Associates indicated that our reserves are now 109% funded. (Continued on page 3)



The required monthly contribution to reserves will be reduced by approximately \$1400.00 monthly for the year 2001.

The final tabulation of the basketball backboards showed 166 in favor of prohibiting backboards and 154 opposing the prohibition. Since 75% were required to amend the CC& R's, the measure failed. Ernie Jones and Ann Kahn were appointed to form a committee to develop proposed rules and guidelines for basketball backboards located in the association.

Safety inspection reports conducted by a Certified Playground Safety Inspector at our three playgrounds found no violations. The BOD approved a bid from Chaidez Tree Service to trim 317 trees and remove 20 others at a cost of \$16,500.00

There being no further business to come before the Board, the meeting was adjourned at 8:45 P.M. The next PPHOA BOD meeting will be October 8, 2000.

A security guard will be on duty from 5:00 to midnight daily until the pools and wader are are shut down.
