

The Board approved the bid from Earthcare to prune seven trees (carrot wood and Tristania) at the spa and kiddy pool areas.


The BOD discussed and approved the purchase of three additional umbrellas for the kids' wading pool deck, for an amount not to exceed \$300.

The Board discussed and approved renewal of the retainer agreement with the consulting law firm Cane, Walker, Harkins, LLP.

The Board reviewed, discussed and approved payment of a bill from the State Fund for \$1268. The Board reviewed and discussed the General Meeting notes of the North Irvine Villages Association. The financial reports were approved subject to final revision by the accountant. Association bank account statements were discussed. A motion was carried to renew the World Savings Bank CD or transfer funds to Edward Jones, whichever has the greatest yield.

The meeting was adjourned at 9:48 p.m. The next Board Meeting has been set for July 12, 2004.

Manager's Report Summer CC&Rs

Home Improvement Reminder

Please submit applications for home improvement projects before work commences. The guidelines read: "The plans processing fee for the Home Improvement Application and/or the Painting Application is \$50. This plan processing fee will be WAIVED, provided approval of the Architectural Committee is obtained BEFORE any work begins on the proposed improvement. If not, the processing fee must be paid and will be a Special Assessment against the homeowner's lot in accordance with Article V, Section 9, of the Master Declaration." The Committee meets on the last Wednesday of each month. Please submit applications no later than the day before.

Motorized Scooters

Did you know that riders do not need a license, must be 16 years or older, cannot ride double, and must wear a helmet? It is illegal to ride these scooters on the sidewalks. Scooter riders must ride in bike lanes, or close to the curb of the street, and travel in the same direction as cars. The scooter must have an operational brake, and if ridden at night, it must have lights and reflectors.

Additional Parking Notes

With summer vacation here, please be reminded that recreational vehicles, boats and trailers cannot be parked on streets or driveways within the association except to be loaded or unloaded. Longer than one day is a violation of your CC&Rs. They must be otherwise parked in the garage or off site.

Your CC&Rs stipulate: "No commercial vehicles may be parked or stored on any lot or street" and "no vehicle may be parked or stored on any Lot or street, except vehicles which are of such dimensions so that they will fit within an enclosed garage on the Lot."

Vehicles parked on a city street in excess of 72 hours without being moved are in violation of city code. Please call the Irvine P.D. if there is a problem.

Glass Containers

Please do not allow any glass containers within the outdoor pool facilities. Any broken glass found in or near the pools will necessitate the closing of that pool for however long it takes to have a pool service come and vacuum that pool. Protect bare feet and let common sense prevail!


