BOARD HIGHLIGHTS

Community News Poolside Matters

On Monday, April 11, 2005, your Park Paseo Board of directors met at the clubhouse for its regularly scheduled meeting. Present were Directors Ernie Jones, Ann Kahn, Mike Krahelski, Ric Cox, and Manager Gus Aarnaes. Brain Hagadorn was absent. Also present was Interior Designer Victoria Pentolino, CPA/Auditor Brad Benton, Northstar Swim Team Representative Carisa Davis, and President of Professional Aquatic Safety Services

Professional Aquatic Safety Services Don Harris.

The minutes of the March 14, 2005 meeting were reviewed and approved as corrected. The Action Items and Responses Report from the March 2005 meeting was also reviewed.

The Board reviewed and discussed the preliminary 2004 association audit report from Brad Benton, CPA, and was approved as corrected. The manager was instructed to discuss two errors with Mr. Benton.

The current ANSI standards for diving boards and the consequent need for removal of the existing dive tower to accommodate a 12-foot board were reviewed and discussed. A bid for replacement was reviewed and with input from the association attorney and

insurance considerations, it was determined that the diving board would be eliminated in the interest of reducing liability exposure. The manager was instructed to arrange for the removal of the diving board.

The association lifeguard service needs were reviewed and discussed in light of the industry standards governing the lifeguard service company. The manager was instructed to obtain bids for pool monitors to compare costs with the current lifeguard charges, which had increased last year (2004) by 45% over the preceding year (2003). The current charges with likely annual increases is excessive.

The Board reviewed and discussed renewal of the Cane, Walker, Harkins LLP retainer agreement for this year. The manager was instructed to renew the agreement.



A recent invoice from Keisker and Wiggle Architects was reviewed and discussed, and the manager was instructed to invite Mr. Wiggle to attend the next Board meeting to discuss this invoice.

Carisa Davis was present to discuss the up-coming swim team season and she was reminded of the need for a team roster, and an officers and coaches roster. Emphasis was placed on communication with the Board through the property manager, and utilization of the Park Press newsletter to highlight team events, awards, records, etc.

A letter from a homeowner requesting fee-waived usage of the clubhouse for the 5th grade pool party for Santiago Hills Elementary School was reviewed and discussed. The letter was approved as submitted with the stipulation that two additional lifeguards would be charged to the school.


The financial reports for March 2005 were approved subject to final revision by the accountant and annual audit. The Association bank account statements were reviewed and discussed. The delinquent account report was reviewed and discussed, and management was requested to send four 30-day reminder letters and one 30-day collection letter.

In regards to the latest update relating to the remodeling effort, design elements, floor medallion, fireplace, budget and vendors were discussed, and the manager was authorized to hire Ted Ostler and Sons for the removal, wall preparation and installation of wallpaper. The manager was also instructed to hire the lower bid for a paint company.

The Architectural Committee meeting minutes of March 2005 were reviewed and approved as corrected. The architectural violation log was also reviewed.

The meeting was adjourned at 9:50 p.m. The next Board meeting has been set for May 9, 2005.

Manager's Report Reminders

Roof Tile Washing

More homeowners are having their original tile roofs pressure washed to remove the dirt and algae that has accumulated over the years. Please note that the washing of these tile roofs does not require approval by the Architectural Committee unless the tiles will also be painted or re-colored; then the process is treated the same as if the house were to be painted. It has been noted that in another community, the newly painted tiles were painted in a rather garish red color that would not be appropriate for our community, thus the need for the approval process.

Diving Board Status

As many of you are aware, the diving board broke last fall and needed to be replaced. Unfortunately, in pursuing a replacement, we have discovered that the diving board codes have changed and that our tower and board do not meet current standards. Because of replacement and insurance costs and especially liability concerns, the Board of Directors have found themselves in the unenviable position of having to decide that we must join the ranks of most other homeowner associations and no longer have a diving board. The diving tower will be removed before this summer season begins.

Clubhouse Remodel Update

The kitchen remodeling effort seems to be on schedule. We are optimistic the project will be completed by the end of May for homeowners to utilize the clubhouse. Please, don't hesitate to call me for updates or if you have any questions.
