BOARD HIGHLIGHTS

On Monday, May 9, 2005, your Park Paseo Board of directors met at the clubhouse for its regularly scheduled meeting. Present were Directors Ernie Jones, Ann Kahn, Brian Hagadorn, Mike Krahelski, Ric Cox, and Manager Gus Aarnaes. Also present was Interior Designer Victoria Pentolino.

The minutes of the April 11, 2005 meeting were reviewed and approved as corrected. The Action Items and Responses Report from the April 2005 meeting was also reviewed.

The leaning block wall at the rear of the properties of 29 and 31 Diamante was reviewed and discussed. The manager is awaiting additional information to determine who is responsible.

The Board reviewed and discussed available options for a pool monitor or lifeguard ser-

vice since the previous season saw a 45% increase in the expenses for lifeguards. It was agreed to continue with the same service as last year.

This year's proposal by RDA to conduct the annual reserve study analysis was reviewed and discussed. The manager was instructed to approve a requisite, every 3rd year on-site analysis for \$1350.00

The Board reviewed and discussed a letter from our pool service vendor, Sweetwater Company, relating to probable increases in our maintenance expenses.





A possible Open House event for the soon-tobe completed clubhouse remodeling project was reviewed and discussed. It was agreed to have an Open House on Monday June 13, from 5:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. to precede that evening's regularly scheduled Board meeting.

The need to have the billiard tables rejuvenated (new felt and pockets) was reviewed and discussed, and the manager was instructed to obtain bids.

The General Meeting notes of the North Irvine Villages Association did not arrive on time for this meeting and will be included in next month's meeting agenda.

A bid for the replacement of the rotted wood on the exterior staircase and an addition of the patio cover over the clubhouse exit doors facing the tennis courts was reviewed and discussed. The manager was requested to research the possibility of a steel circular fire escape staircase.

The Board reviewed and discussed the latest development through Robco Insurance relating to a request for premium credit for the removal of the diving board and the subsequent denial of coverage from the current insurance carrier. The manager will follow-up to assure there is no lapse in coverage.

The financial reports for May 2005 were approved subject to final revision by the accountant and annual audit. The Association bank account statements were reviewed and discussed. The delinquent account report was reviewed and discussed, and management was requested to send five 30-day reminder letters.

The Board reviewed and discussed the latest update relating to the remodeling effort.

The Architectural Committee meeting minutes of April 2005 were reviewed and approved as corrected. The architectural violation log was also reviewed.

The meeting was adjourned at 9:50 p.m. The next Board meeting has been set for June 13, 2005.

Manager's Report Summer Swim Season

SUMMER SCHEDULE

The summer schedule at both the Christamon Pool and the Prosa Pool will commence on June 23 and continue through the summer, and perhaps longer depending on weather conditions. During this time, lifeguards will be on duty from 12:00 noon until 8:00 p.m. at both pools daily. Security guards will be on duty from 10:00 a.m. until midnight daily at the Christamon Pool. They will be stationed just under the enclosure to sign homeowners in. Please be cooperative about signing in and showing your key so that we can properly maintain our beautiful facility and eliminate trespassers.

REMINDERS

- Children under 14 years of age <u>cannot</u> come to the pool unless accompanied by an adult (18 years or older). The only exception to this is a child who has a valid, registered green tag who may come to the pool <u>any time a lifeguard is on duty</u>. They may not <u>bring guests</u>.
- Blue Tag swimmers (on the Northstars team) may only come to the pool unsupervised when their age group is practicing during official swim team practice.
- Babysitters bringing children to the pool must be physically present at all times with the children, and must supervise them at all times. Babysitters cannot be outside the pool area when their charges are inside.

Your cooperation is much appreciated.


