On Monday, July 11, 2005, your Park Paseo Board of Directors met at the clubhouse for its regularly scheduled meeting. Present were Directors Ernie Jones, Ann Kahn, Brian Hagadorn, Mike Krahelski, Ric Cox, and Manager Gus Aarnaes.


The minutes of the June 13, 2005 meeting were reviewed and approved as corrected. The Action Items and Responses Report from the June 2005 meeting was also reviewed.

The latest insurance cost information updates relating to having a diving board for the main pool facility were reviewed and discussed. The Board is awaiting complete bids since the possibility exists of changing the current broker as well as the insurance carriers.

Two problem irrigation valves that had to be replaced were reviewed and discussed. The manager was given authorization to pre-approve emergency type repairs only, with a review to occur at the subsequent Board of Director's meeting.

The Board reviewed and discussed a proposal from Earthcare to replant the clubhouse entry and install sod in the area next to the pool equipment enclosure. The manager was instructed to have Earthcare proceed with these two projects.

The Board reviewed and discussed the problems, code-compliance, and additional expenses involved in replacing the exterior emergency exit from the second story in the clubhouse. The manager was instructed to obtain three bids for a replacement steel staircase in order to minimize the problems typically associated with wood units.

The Board reviewed and discussed an AON settlemen for which our association is eligible. The manager was instructed to complete the necessary forms to share in the settlement.


The Board reviewed and discussed the General Meeting notes of the North Irvine Villages Association.

Manager's Report Summer Reminders

Prosa Pool Duck Mess

This office has received a number of complaints relating to duck mess in and around the Prosa pool. I have made repeated attempts via this newsletter to ask homeowners not to feed the ducks. By feeding them, they will not leave and will have baby ducklings that in turn will return to the pool, etc. etc. We do the best we can to clean up this mess. The pool service company cleans the pool four days a week during the summer, but with constant feeding, we cannot be rid of the problem. Feeding these ducks at home does not take in to account the duck's desire for a body of water someplace. Think; if you were to have a pool in your back yard and wouldn't want ducks dumping in it, then please don't feed the ducks.

Sand Problem

This is an appeal for homeowners to help us with another pool-related problem. According to our pool service company, the amount of sand ending up in our Christamon main pool and especially the children's wading pool is excessive. The drains are being clogged, the filters plugged prematurely and tearing, and the pump motors are being damaged. Please remind children to try and remove the sand from their bodies before running from the playground sandbox to the pools. We also have had the drinking fountain repaired due to all the sand clogged in the unit. Let's keep the sand out of the pools and drinking fountain!

Jacuzzi Soap Problem

We recently had to drain the spa due to excessive soap/ detergent that had been dumped in the unit. Please know that when someone does this, it plugs the filters with a filmy residue and turns the water a disgusting color. Unfortunately, the spa needs to be drained and refilled with water and appropriate chemicals and if necessary, the filters must be disassembled and cleaned. This activity will shut the spa down for three days. Bubble baths are great at home, but not in the association Jacuzzi.
