BOARD HIGHLIGHTS

COMMUNITY NEWS

On Wednesday, January 10, 2007 your Park Paseo Board of Directors met at the clubhouse for its postponed regularly scheduled meeting. Present were Directors Brian Hagadorn, Ric Cox, Howard Scott, Ernie Jones, and Manager Gus Aarnaes. Brian Grochow was absent.

The minutes of the December 11, 2006 meeting were reviewed and approved as corrected. The Action Items and Responses Report from the

December 2006 meeting was also reviewed.

A homeowner was present to show cause why the association fine process should not be initiated for an on-going architectural violation relating to an aging wood shake roof. The Board agreed to table any decision for sixty days to allow the owners time to finalize their home expansion plans. An update will be submitted before the March BOD meeting.

Another homeowner was not able to attend, but the BOD reviewed and discussed whether a fine process should be initiated for

an on-going architectural violation relating to a broken utility door with missing slats. The Board agreed that an order for a new door must be placed by January 20 and installed by 60 days or March 20. If not completed by then, the association fine process will begin.

The Board reviewed and discussed a letter, forwarded to a homeowner, by six neighbors complaining about unsafe and excessive driving speeds on their street. The Board is very concerned that the residents of the community are aware of the maximum 25 mile per hour legal speed limit. This is a maximum limit, which can still be excessive when children are at play in the neighborhood. The Board instructed the manager to place an article in the Park Press reminding drivers to be extra safe when driving in our community.



The Board reviewed and discussed the need for trimming of some of the Iron Bark Eucalyptus trees. The manager was instructed to have a bid prepared for the next Board meeting identifying the trees and locations.

The Board reviewed and discussed an agreement with Patrol One to allow for a \$50.00 deduction from invoices for any failure by them to properly lock or unlock the facilities as necessary per our contract.

The Board reviewed and discussed the renewal proposal from Robco Insurance for the Association earthquake insurance coverage. The Board agreed to accept the proposal for \$18280.00 to renew all the association insurance coverage unless a vendor the manager has contacted can bid less.

The General Meeting notes of the North Irvine Villages Association for last month and this month were reviewed and discussed.

The financial reports for December 2006 were approved subject to final revision by the accountant and annual audit. The Association bank account statements were reviewed and discussed. The delinquent account report was reviewed and discussed, and management was requested to send six 30-day reminder letters and two attorney warning letters.

The Architectural Committee meeting minutes of December 27th were approved as corrected. The architectural violation log was reviewed.

The meeting was adjourned at 9:26 pm and the next Board meeting has been set for February 12, 2007.

Missing Mail

Drive Safely

This office has been made aware of concerns by some homeowners of unsafe driving habits within our community. Some residents may not be aware that the legal speed limit within our community is 25 miles per hour. This is a maximum limit and does not mean we should all be driving at 25 miles per hour. Remember that this is a family oriented community. Especially when there are children present, 25 miles per hour is too fast. Given the short length of our streets, does anyone really believe they are saving any significant time by being in a hurry on our streets? Please be safe, slow down, be extra alert and be a safe and courteous driver!

Blocked Sidewalks

On occasion, this office sends letters to homeowners reminding them not to block the sidewalks and walkways within our community with parked vehicles, toys (portable basketball units) and overgrowth from trees, bushes and plants.
