BOARD HIGHLIGHTS

On Monday, November 12, 2007, your Park Paseo Board of Directors met at the clubhouse for its regularly scheduled meeting. Present were Directors Brian Hagadorn, Howard Scott, Ric Cox, Miki Krahelski, and Tanja Fournier. Also present was manager Gus Aarnaes.

The minutes of the October BOD meeting. Annual Membership meeting. Reconvened Annual

Membership meeting, and Organizational BOD meeting were reviewed and approved as corrected. The Action Items and Responses Report from the October 8, 2007 meeting was also reviewed.

The Board reviewed a letter from the City of Irvine responding to our letter of concern regarding potential traffic safety issues at Fortuna East and the intersection of Diamante and Prosa. The city agreed to paint a section of curb along Prosa red and to stripe the center of the first entry curve into Fortuna East.

A homeowner appeal to have architectural violation fines waived due to sickness and travel was reviewed. The Board declined to waive the fines due to the lack of communication and length of time elapsed.

The successful and exciting Northstar swim season with the President of the Northstars was discussed. Apparently, the team roster will be filled next season.

The Board agreed to hear a homeowner with concerns about the association windrow trees at a future meeting since the homeowner was not present for the November meeting.

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COMMUNITY NEWS LAST MONTHS FIRE STORMS

Last month's fires were a wake-up call to all living residents. The fire came dangerously close to our neighborhood reminding us of the safety that our homes, schools and local businesses provide for our everyday existence. 
years. The prediction is that there are many more "red flag" days ahead.

The Board discussed the up-coming Orange County Marathon scheduled for Sunday, January 6, 2008.

The Board discussed possible inclusion in the Park Press newsletter an article to motivate the remaining wood-shingle roof owners to replace their roofs. It was approved.

A homeowner's request for fee-waived use of the clubhouse for Daisy Girl Scout Troop was approved subject to completion of the contract and receipt of the \$100 deposit.

The Board reviewed and discussed the bid from Bradford Benton, CPA to conduct and prepare the ongoing association audit and taxes for the fiscal year ending December 31, 2007. Upon a motion by Howard Scott, seconded by Ric Cox, and carried unanimously, the Board agreed to accept the bid for \$2165.00 for the annual audit and preparation of tax returns.

The Board discussed whether to store or throw out an original outdoor organization chart. It was agreed to throw it away.

The General Meeting notes from North Irvine Villages Association from October and November were reviewed.

The financial reports for October 2007 were approved subject to final revision by the accountant and annual audit. The Association bank account statements were reviewed and discussed. The delinquent account report was discussed, and management was requested to send three 30-day reminder letters and two attorney warning letters to delinquent accounts.

The proposed budget for the 2008 year was discussed. The budget was approved with a two dollar increase in monthly dues, bringing it to \$70.00 beginning with the January 2008 payment.

A summary of proposed, possible, upcoming and future projects for the association was reviewed. This listing is intended to be evolutionary and to enable the Board to prioritize projects.

The Architectural Committee meeting minutes of November 1, 2007 were reviewed and were approved as corrected. The architectural violation log was reviewed.

The meeting was adjourned at 10:00 pm and the next Board meeting has been set for December 10, 2007.



The holiday season is approaching, bringing joy, happiness, and new opportunities for everyone—especially burglars. The rise in burglaries is attributed to the mass purchase of merchandise and the tendency for many of us to let our guard down during the holiday season. We suggest that you follow these security measures to reduce your risk of being a burglar's next holiday victim.

Around The House

Always close your drapes when you're not home so you're not exposing your holiday gifts.

Put lights on timers to make it look as if you're not home even while you're at parties and shopping.

Always remember to lock your doors and windows when leaving, even if it's only for a brief time.

Holiday Shopping

Try to park near a busy entrance to the shopping mall or store.

Carry only \$100 or less in cash when shopping. Many malls have indoor ATM's where you can get money.

Carry only one credit card and use it for all purchases.

When resting, don't leave your packages on the ground.

Have your car keys in your hand so you don't have to linger before entering your car. Keys can also serve as a weapon against an attacker. Avoid setting down your purchases when getting into your car.

Put purchases in the trunk, not on the back seat of your car, so potential thieves can't see them.

If you think you are being followed, drive to a public place or police station. If it is unsafe to get out of your car, honk your horn and flash your lights.

If your car breaks down, open the hood and attach a white cloth to your antenna. If someone stops to help, stay in your locked car (windows up) and ask him or her to call the police or a garage.
