MANAGER'S CORNER

Monthly Dues Late after the 15th

Our homeowner association fees are due on the 1st of the month. A late charge may be assessed if they are not received by the fifteenth of the month. A number of homeowners are sending their checks out around the 12th and gambling that the U.S.P.S. will get them to ASYST by the 15th, thereby avoiding a late charge. Normally this works. But when there is a delay in mail delivery and you see a late charge appear on your statement, please do not

phone our office to ask for a reversal of the late charge. You gambled and lost! If you want to avoid late charges, send in your dues with your statement to arrive at the ASYST office around the 1st of the month (when they are due) and you will eliminate the possibility of incurring a late charge.

Vinyl Window Replacement

Many homeowners have applied for and installed new vinyl windows to upgrade the look and efficiency of their homes. However, a number of homeowners have only partially completed the installation process and have two or three different colors or

styles of windows showing. This is in violation of the Architectural guidelines established by the Board and the Architectural Committee years ago when they created the new rules: All windows must be of the same design and color. The Board has directed the manager to send out letters of violation to all homeowners who have yet to complete their window installations.

New Start Time for Board Meetings



Fourth of July Celebration!


This year, July 4th falls on a Saturday, and will be upon us very quickly. We look forward to our annual celebration for Park Paseo families at the main



BOARD HIGHLIGHTS

On Monday June 8, 2009 your Park Paseo Board of Directors met at the clubhouse for its regularly scheduled meeting. Present were Directors Howard Scott, Mike Krahelski, Roland Philipp, Tanja Fournier, and Brian Hagadorn. Also present were manager Gus Aarnaes, Ric Cox, and four homeowners. The minutes of the May 13, 2009 BOD meeting were approved as corrected. The Action Items and Responses Report from the May 13, 2009 meeting was also reviewed.

The Board discussed a concern expressed by two homeowners over the possible expansion of the Santi-

ago Hills school parking lot. IUSD has been mandated by ADA regulations to modify the existing lot and to reduce the number of spaces by seven for handicapped access and for a new exit ramp for buses. The

Board directed the manager to contact IUSD for information about a timeline for these plans.

The Board reviewed and discussed two design variations for a large remodel project and requested the homeowner to produce an artistic rendition with elevations depicted in order to better visualize the project and its impact on the neighborhood. The Board reviewed two ongoing architectural violations relating to a tree damaging association property and a misplaced storage shed. The first homeowner failed to appear and the Board instructed the manager to contact our attorney to draft a letter to be sent to the homeowner outlining his potential liability and costs of repairing or replacing the wall and having the tree removed. The second homeowner failed to submit an application for the shed as requested and was fined \$25.00.

The BOD acknowledged the Jerry and Janie Rounsavelle family (see photo page 4) at 24 Lucero East for winning the July 2009 landscape award.

The BOD reviewed and approved the Architectural Committee meeting minutes of April 29, & May 27, 2009. The violation log was reviewed. The financial material for May, 2009 was reviewed. The delinquent account report was discussed, and management was requested to send out three attorney warning letters. One homeowner account was scheduled to be turned over to the attorney for collection.

The meeting was adjourned at 10:30 p.m., and the next Board meeting is scheduled for July 13, 2009 at 6:30 p.m.

Community News

Illegal Fireworks

Virtually every year I receive complaints of fireworks going off at night within the community before, during, and after the 4th of July. This is illegal and unsafe. There is a risk of injury and fire, especially to homes with wood shingle roofs. Please call the police department immediately at 949.724.7200 to report any illegal fireworks activity.

Swimming Diapers

If you have a youngster too young or unable to control their bathroom needs, please, please make your child wear a swimming diaper! It is very inconsiderate to your fellow homeowners and guests when they find the pool closed because of an "accident" in the pool. The fact is most accidents necessitating pool closure can be prevented with the use of a swimming diaper. Be reminded that health laws require that any pool must be closed for 24 hours after a special clean-up is scheduled and completed. This means our pool would be closed for a minimum of 24 hours to clean-up an accident.

Learn the ABC's of Pool Safety

California leads the nation in drownings. Drowning prevention and water safety should be practiced during the summer months.

A — Adult Supervision — Assign a "Water Watcher"

- Supervise children in and around the pool/spa area, especially during social gatherings.
- NEVER leave children unattended.
- Do not rely on floatation devices.
- Remove children from the pool/spa when in the restroom or on the phone.

B — Barriers

- Install/maintain fencing around pool to isolate from home/play areas.
- Use protection layers such as safety covers, gate alarms, door alarms. Inspect them monthly.
- Make sure all gates are self-closing, self-latching, and open outward away from the pool.
- Remove objects that allow a child to climb up to reach the gate latch or climb over the fence.

C — Classes — "CPR"

- Learn CPR, first aid and rescue techniques.
- Attain swim skills through on-going qualified instruction.
- Keep rescue equipment (shepherd's hook, lifesaving ring, CPR sign) mounted by the pool to instruct others.
