
Fourth of July Celebration



BOARD HIGHLIGHTS

On Monday July 13, 2009 your Park Paseo Board of Directors met at the clubhouse for its regularly scheduled meeting. Present were Directors Howard Scott, Mike Krahelski, Roland Philipp, Tanja Fournier, and Brian Hagadorn. Also present were managers Gus Aarnaes, & Ric Cox, Architectural Coordinator Ernie Jones, and seven homeowners. The minutes of the June 8, 2009 BOD meeting were approved as corrected. The Action Items and Responses Report from the June 8, 2009

meeting was also reviewed.

The Board reviewed a large remodel project on Diamante and approved the basic design. The owners were directed to complete detailed plans and submit them to the Architectural Committee for review and possible approval. The Board reviewed five ongoing architectural violations including: a tree damaging association property, a board on a roof, miscellaneous items left in an overgrown front yard, missing siding shingles, and dues delinguencies.

The BOD acknowledged the Lazarovits family (see photo page 4) at 12 Kara East for winning the August landscaping award.

The Board discussed the current renovation of the Santi-

ago Hills school and 6.6.6.6.6. parking lot. The revised current plan calls for NO parking lot space removals. The new plans also show a future 30-space expansion to the north through the existing

driveway but it is not currently funded.


The BOD reviewed proposals for rules changes including establishing the pool enclosures as non-smoking areas, improper curbside bin violations, and windows and directed the Manager to complete the revisions of the Architectural Rules so that the BOD may finalize them for homeowner review and acceptance.

The Board approved a motion to replace two large and messy Ficus trees near the spa gate entrance with palm

The delinquent account report was discussed, and management was requested to send out five 30-day reminder letters. One homeowner account was scheduled to be turned over to the attorney for collection.


The meeting was adjourned at 11:25 p.m., and the next Board meeting is scheduled for August 10, 2009 at 6:30 p.m.
