Cell Tower Information Meeting

Trillium Consulting Company has approached the Park Paseo Board with a request to increase cell phone coverage in North Irvine by installing a unique 3-flagpole facility just south of our tennis courts in the planter area. Unlike traditional cell phone towers, these forty-five foot flagpoles would be painted brown to blend in with our architectural theme and fly the American, California, and Park Paseo logo flags. Park Paseo HOA would receive a

small amount of income from the company which could help us hold our monthly dues down.

Before proceeding further, your BOD would like to hear input from our community concerning such an installation. We have scheduled a community information meeting on Thursday, March 25th at 7:00 p.m. in our clubhouse to view a photographic mockup and architectural drawings of the flagpoles and to have your questions answered. We would like to hear your thoughts about this possible construction.

Dog Owner Responsibilities





BOARD HIGHLIGHTS

On Monday February 8, 2010 your Park Paseo Board of Directors met at the clubhouse for its regularly scheduled meeting. Present were Directors Howard Scott, Mike Krahelski, and Brian Hagadorn. Also present were co-managers Gus Aarnaes and Ric Cox. The minutes of the January 11, 2010 BOD meeting were approved as corrected. The Action Item/Responses Report from the January 11, 2010 meeting was also reviewed.

The Board reviewed architectural violations regarding a garage door in need of repainting, an improperly located satellite dish in the front of a house, and failure to put away trash receptacles. The Board voted to set a deadline for repainting the garage door, thank the homeowner for relocating the satellite dish, and begin the fine process for the homeowner who had a pattern of leaving trash receptacles on the driveway

The BOD reviewed the proposal from Earth Care Landscape to plant two king palms, madd mulch to beds, and extend the existing hedge next to the spa gate and voted to approve the



the clubhouse to hear input from the community on a possible cell tower installation south of our tennis courts.

bid at a cost not to exceed \$1500.00. The BOD also approved a proposal to replace a poorly growing Chinese elm tree near 44 Diamante with an incense cedar tree at a cost of \$170.00.

The BOD spoke to the representative from Trillium Consultants who would like to install a flagpole-type cell tower in Park Paseo in the planter adjacent to the tennis courts. The BOD directed management to set up a public information meeting so that our community could provide input before the BOD made any decisions. The meeting was set for Thursday, March 25th at 7:00 p.m. in the clubhouse.

The BOD postponed action on re-tiling the women's showers at the main pool until license and insurance information could be obtained from the contractor.

The BOD acknowledged the Brooks Family at 34 Christamon West (see photo page 4) for winning the monthly landscaping award.

The Architectural Committee meeting minutes of January 27, 2010 were approved as corrected. The violation log was reviewed. The financial material for fourth quarter 2009 was reviewed and approved.

Conservation Tips

Indoor Water Conservation Ideas

You can reduce your water consumption by 20-40 percent without purchasing expensive equipment. Reducing water use can mean substantial savings on water, sewage, and energy bills. The following suggestions could help you get in the habit of saving water:

Kitchen

- Avoid using the garbage disposal. It uses a lot of unnecessary water. Start a compost pile instead.
- Run automatic dishwashers only with a full load
- Keep a container of water in the refrigerator for cold drinks. If you have to run your tap while waiting for cold water, collect running water in a pitcher.

Bath

- Turn off the tap while brushing your teeth or shaving.
- Take shorter showers. During droughts, turn off water while soaping up.



Included are energy-efficient vinyl windows, skylights, heat pumps, insulation, furnaces, & central A/C systems. 
