Christamon Patio Cover Completed




Fourth of July Celebration!

BOARD HIGHLIGHTS

On Monday, June 13, 2011 your Park Paseo Board of Directors met at the clubhouse for its regularly scheduled meeting. Present were Directors Tanja Fournier, Mike Krahelski, Howard Scott, and Brian Hagadorn. Also present were co-managers Gus Aarnaes & Ric Cox and one homeowner. The minutes of the May 9, 2011 BOD meeting were approved as corrected. The Action Items/ Responses Report from the May 9, 2011 meeting was also reviewed.

The minutes of the April 27, 2011 & May 25, 2011 Architectural Committee meetings were reviewed and approved. The violation log was reviewed. The BOD reviewed a proposal from Earthcare to modify the irriga-

tion and softscape around the clubhouse to avoid overspray on the newly painted stucco walls and clubhouse and voted to approve \$765.00 for the modifications. The BOD also approved spending \$400.00 to install a new light outside the gate between the spa and tennis court to illuminate the entry

The BOD voted to replace the BBQ's at the Prosa pool. They also voted to install a light at the gate between the spa & tennis court to illuminate the entry area. The BOD decided to install drip irrigation in the clubhouse/spa area to minimize water damage on our newly painted stucco walls and clubhouse.

The BOD voted to allocate up to \$1300.00 to replace and repair damaged bricks on our pilasters and stucco walls. The BOD discussed a proposal for additional work needed on our aluminum patio cover and voted to spend an additional \$5232.00 to complete the project. The BOD discussed the use of SCUBA equipment and lessons at our pools and, because of recent damage, determined that these lessons are not appropriate at our facilities. The BOD also voted to renew the \$120.00 annual membership in the Community Associations Institute(CAI.) The BOD acknowledged the Drake family at 25 Eden for winning the monthly landscape award.

The financial material for April 2011 was reviewed. The delinquent account report was discussed & management was requested to send four 30-day reminder letters, one attorney warning letter, and to turn four accounts over to the attorney for collection pending receipt of payments.

The meeting was adjourned at 9:07 p.m. The next Board meeting is scheduled for Monday, July 11, 2011 at 6:30 p.m.

Community News Summer Safety Tips

Learn the ABC's of Pool Safety

California leads the nation in drownings. Drowning prevention and water safety should be practiced during the summer months.

A — Adult Supervision — Assign a "Water Watcher"

- Supervise children in and around the pool/spa area, especially during social gatherings.
- NEVER leave children unattended.
- Do not rely on floatation devices.
- Remove children from the pool/spa when in the restroom or on the phone.

B — Barriers

- Install/maintain fencing around pool to isolate from home/play areas.
- Use protection layers such as safety covers, gate alarms, door alarms. Inspect them monthly.
- Make sure all gates are self-closing, self-latching, and open outward away from the pool.
- Remove objects that allow a child to climb up to reach the gate latch or climb over the fence.

C — Classes — "CPR"

- Learn CPR, first aid and rescue techniques.
- Attain swim skills through on-going qualified instruction.
- Keep rescue equipment (shepherd's hook, life-saving ring, CPR sign) mounted by the pool to instruct others.


Swimming Diapers

If you have youngsters too young or unable to control their bathroom needs, please, please make them wear swimming diapers! It is very inconsiderate to your fellow homeowners and guests when they find the pool closed because of an "accident" in the pool. The fact is most accidents necessitating pool closure can be prevented with the use of a swimming diaper. Be reminded that health laws require that any public pool must be closed for 24 hours after a special clean-up is scheduled and completed. This means our pool would be closed for a minimum of 24 hours to clean-up an accident. Better be safe than sorry!

POOL GATES

Please do not leave the pool facility entry gates ajar or block them open with chairs . Help encourage everyone to close the gates! We cannot have unattended children in the neighborhood access the pools. Nor can we have children within the facility get out to the street. There is no inconvenience so great that overlooks the safety of our children. PLEASE KEEP THE GATES SHUT.
